SUBJECT: URGENT PRIMARY INFORMATION

This year's Republican Primary for the Governor's Office will have both former County Executive Rob Astorino and NY Congressman Lee Zeldin of Long Island on the ballot.

WCFOA is endorsing Rob Astorino in this primary.

As County Executive, Rob Astorino was very supportive of firearm owners. He brought back guns shows to Westchester. He streamlined the Pistol License Unit making possible 2 week amendments, 3 month application decisions, and instituted electronic finger printing which reduced processing time. Rob has made repeal of the SAFE ACT one of his priorities.

To vote in the primary, one must be a registered Republican. Those who are **not** registered to vote **must** have their paperwork in to the Board of Elections **BEFORE** February 11, 2022.

For those who are Democrat, Conservative or Independent party members, party affiliation can be **TEMPORARILY** changed in order to vote in the Republican primary. To do so call the BOARD OF ELECTIONS (914-995-5700, 5713) and request a "Change of Party" form. After the primary one can easily re-submit the same form to return to their prior party.

Polls show that Lee Zeldin has very low support and name recognition north of Westchester County, leading to the conclusion that he cannot win the election. During his term as a New York Senator he was "absent" for the SAFE ACT vote, and has voted to pass budgets that funded the SAFE ACT provisions and other gun control laws. This has caused firearm owners to lose confidence in Zeldin and they will not support his candidacy.
